## **Facts & Figures: 2001-2002**

**Founded:** 1930; Seeley G. Mudd Building completed in 1975

**Total operating budget 2001/02:** 3.9 million

**Staff:** 46.72 FTE including 15.8 professional librarians

**Staffing:** Open 96 hours per week; Information Services staffed 57 hours per week

**Collection:** 272,767 volumes including 2,276 current print subscriptions and an outstanding Trent Collection in the History of Medicine; 1,742 electronic journal titles; 90 audiovisual items

**Total items added to collection:** 5,480

**Total number of primary clients:** 13,023

**Seating capacity:** 470

**Lending of items (external circulation):** 27,516

**Gate count:** 166,550

**Photocopies made by clients:** 1,311,105

**Net assignable square feet:** 47,526

**Reference services:** 31,326 questions were answered at the Information Desk and other service points.

**Interlibrary loan:** 2,874 items were borrowed; 23,905 items were lent to others (filled requests).

**Document delivery for items on campus:** 148 items requested for Medical Center clients from other Duke libraries.

**In-house photocopy services:** 3,430 articles copied.

**User education:** 2,296 clients attended 251 orientations and instructional teaching sessions.

**Self-service computerized databases:** Free access is available to the Ovid databases MEDLINE, Books@Ovid, Evidence Based Medicine Reviews, International Pharmaceutical Abstracts, Journals@Ovid Full Text, Nursing & Allied Health (CINAHL), PreMEDLINE, PsycINFO, and SPORTDiscus. Approximately 3,000 Medical Center password holders are currently registered to access this data through terminals in the Library and remotely. ISI Web of Science (Citation Databases), Alt-Health Watch, HIM (Historical Images in Medicine), Community of Science (COS), SPIN (Sponsored Programs Information Network), IRIS (Illinois Researcher Information Service), AMA-FREIDA, TOXLINE, Micromedex, Clinical Pharmacology, Harrison's Online, Scientific American Medicine Online, MD Consult, PubMed, and other databases are available for use via our Website at <http://www.mclibrary.duke.edu/>.
